As you know, behaviour is one of the areas we have been focusing on. We have now completed our new behaviour policy and this will be sent out as soon as it has been agreed by governors.

It gives a clear framework for behaviour to ensure Queen's Park is a kind, respectful and safe community in which everyone can learn.

It outlines how we promote and celebrate each child and their positive learning behaviours and attitudes.

It outlines the expectations of behaviour at our school.

It explains how we support children to manage their behaviour and self-regulate.

It explains the steps for dealing with incidents.

It details how bullying behaviour, if it happens, is managed.

We have also worked with staff and children to develop our behaviour curriculum. A behaviour curriculum outlines our expected routines and consistencies around school. Your child should be able to talk you through some of the behaviour routines mentioned below.
