We want to children to love coming to school because they feel safe, happy and excited by irresistible learning opportunities.

As a school, we are working hard to improve behaviour across the school through high expectations of behaviour and attitudes, clarity of messaging and application of our new behaviour consistencies.

Through our phase of rapid improvement, our curriculum is being designed to incorporate the development of emotional regulation, collaboration and co-operation. We are teaching children to be part of a kind and inclusive community and understand their responsibilities in ensuring a harmonious community.

A crucial aspect of ensuring children feel safe and happy within their school community is our approach to anti-bullying work within the school.

Our anti-bullying work is being embedded into our daily provision within school. We are designing a curriculum to teach:

- kindness and inclusion
- conflict resolution
- safe and unsafe behaviours
- the difference between right and wrong
- resilience
- respect
- the power of community

We are incorporating game packs and playground buddies at break and lunch times with play leaders role-modelling appropriate play.
