Enjoy your weekend everyone!



AT QUEEN'S PARK

We wanted to let about an exciting change for Queen's Park Primary School. In the Summer Term, we will be introducing a 'House system' across the school.

What is it, and how will it work?

From May, children will be assigned to one of 4 houses which they will be a member of for the duration of their time at Queen's Park. All houses will have children from every year group in them and siblings will always be placed in the same house.

Houses will meet weekly and children will hand in house points which have been collected throughout the week as rewards for displaying school values or praise for positive efforts/work. Each week, the winning house will be announced by totaling all of the points collected and at the end of the year, there will be a winning house! Houses will also work together to plan fundraisers and participate in house activities and competitions e.g. sports day or charity events. They will also have the opportunity to voice suggestions for our school's next steps.

Why are we doing this?

As a two-form entry school, we are keen that children across the age ranges have the opportunity to get to know one another and further strengthen the importance of community. We believe that having a 'House system' is a fantastic and fun way to do this.

To enter, children or families will just need to write their suggested names for each of the new Houses on the piece of paper similar to the format below and return it to their class teacher, or reply via the message on our School Ping. You may want to supply a short paragraph to accompany your ideas, to explain or support your suggested names.

The closing date for all entries is Thursday 8th February. The winning names will be announced in the week beginning 19th February.

Why not join our Governing Body?

It's been a bright start to the new year, which governors started full of enthusiasm, galvanised by the recent news that our campaign against plans to reduce our school places has been successful. Well done and thank you all, what a fantastic endorsement of our school.

The campaign reminded me of why – as a parent, a long time ago - I decided to get involved in our school's governing body: A core belief that this school is a vital hub of our community worth fighting for. Since then, it has been an absolute joy to be involved in the school's improvement journey.

Did you know?

The Governing Body is the strategic leader of the school. The team consists of the head teacher, staff - and parent governors, as well as co-opted governors, who are all volunteers.

It has a vital role to play in making sure every child gets the best possible education, and focuses on three core functions:

Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction

Holding the leaders to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff

Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

You don't see much of us, but we are closely involved in the school and are currently looking for parent governors to join our team.

Because governors' work is not very visible, it may feel that a lot of specific knowledge is required to take on that role, however that's not the case.

It's a voluntary role, a great opportunity for personal development and a wide range of training and support is available. All you need is a passion for our children's schooling!

We want our governing body to reflect and represent our diverse community and we will work actively to overcome any barriers prospective Governors may have to joining our team.





WINTER/SPRING TERM 2024 Encore Tennis Club [Years 3 to 6]



Tennis club for children in years 3 to 6 will on Wednesdays after school at Queens Park Tennis Club, East Drive, BN2 OBQ www.qptc.co.uk from 3:30-4:30pm.





The club is run by local LTA award winning coach (Queens Park Tennis Club) Jimmy Smith, a Level 3 LTA qualified with over 15 years' experience. These tennis sessions will be a great introduction to the game of tennis with fun filled activities and match play to help develop your child's coordination, balance, and fitness levels. I will run each end of term session as a fun competition to help the children develop their knowledge of scoring and match play. The children will have an opportunity to join our weekly tennis courses at Queens Park Tennis Club if they show a keen interest in the game.

Children will need to bring PE kits, water bottle and a tennis racket if they have one. Rackets can be provided. The club costs **£6 per week (£60 per term) per child** and is to be paid in full before they start.

The Tennis club will run for **10 weeks from Wednesday 17th January until Wednesday 27th March 2024** inclusive, excluding the February Half-Term (12th – 16th February). Your child will be walked after school by Jimmy to the tennis club, and you should collect your child from **Queens Park Tennis Club at 4:30pm.**

Some of you may have heard about **Early Help** ...we thought it would be helpful to explain a little bit about them...

What is Early Help?

Early Help is support offered to families experiencing a range of issues.

It brings together appropriate professionals who will work with the whole family to try to make things improve for everyone because often, when one person in a family has a challenge, it will affect other people in the family too.

The support offered might be about parenting challenges, employment issues, attendance issues, financial challenges, challenging behaviour or emotional well being to name a few. Whatever problem you might be experiencing some Early Help might help support your family.

If school, or another professional working with you, suggests you might benefit from Early Help they will ask your permission to make a referral. You can also refer yourself for help on this link here.

Early help services are aimed at supporting children and families without a social worker.

Once the referral is made there is usually a wait to find out if you will receive some support. Once a worker has been allocated they will talk with you – and more importantly listen to you – to find out about the difficulties that you and your family are having.

They will also want to know about what is going well for your family and any strengths that you have that can be built upon. The worker will ask about the extra support that you think you might need and advise you on what is available. Once they have advised you on what support can be offered you will be able to benefit from different professionals help.

This support can last 12 weeks or be extended if there is more work to be done. It is usually coordinated by a Family Hub Worker who are based at the 4 new Family Hub centres across Brighton.

You and your family are at the centre of this supportive process with the aim being to address whatever challenges you are facing quickly so that they don't get too big.



What are Family Hubs?

Family Hubs provide families with a single access point to combined family support services for early help with a variety of support.

They can help children from conception to 19 years old (25 with SEND)
